- (7) Appointed by the Mayor:
 - Public safety;
 - Environmental stewardship;
 - Economic development or tourism;
 - Maritime management or policy;
 - Athletics and recreation; and
 - Maritime transportation.
- (7) Appointed by the Chairman of the Council:
 - Two ANC representatives;
 - Two BID representatives;
 - Two marina or yacht club representatives; and
 - An individual with expertise or interest in waterway management.

- 1. The orderly, safe, and efficient use of the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers and the Washington Channel for **boating and recreation**;
- 2. <u>Public and private uses of property</u> and infrastructure adjacent to the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers and the Washington Channel;
- **3.** <u>Interagency and regional coordination</u> on issues relevant to the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers, the Washington Channel, and adjacent property;
- **4.** Environmental conservation and management of the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers, the Washington Channel, and adjacent property;
- 5. Strategies for coordinated <u>economic growth</u> on and adjacent to the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers and the Washington Channel;
- Assessments of <u>safety and security risks</u> and needs on and adjacent to the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers and the Washington Channel;
- 7. Identification of <u>transportation gaps</u> on and adjacent to the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers and the Washington Channel; and
- 8. Opportunities to **increase local control** of the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers, the Washington Channel, and adjacent property.
